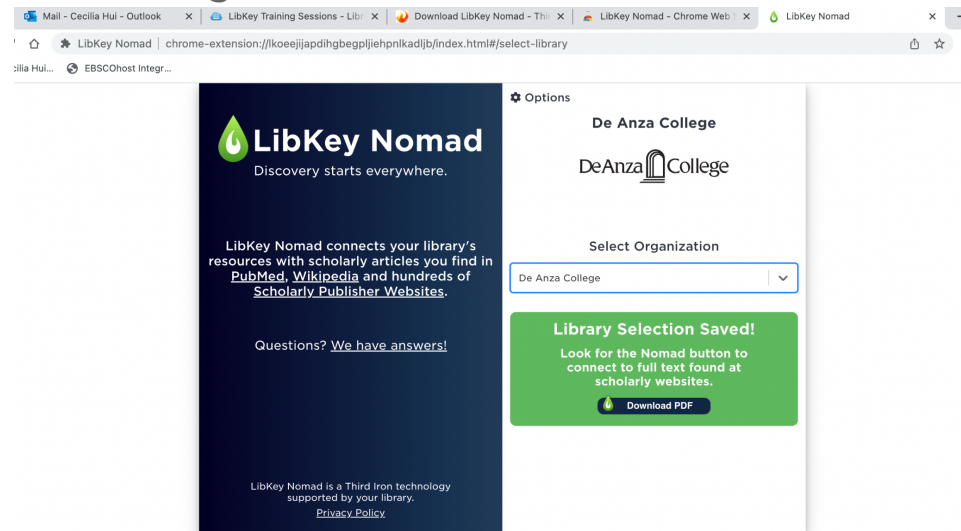
LibKey Nomad - a new library service for All

LibKey Nomad is a browser extension for Firefox, Chrome, Edge, Brave and Vivaldi browsers. It connects researchers to library-licensed and open access full text articles referenced on PubMed, Wikipedia and publisher's websites instant and in one-click.

The purpose is to help individual researchers to find De Anza owned full text articles faster and easier.

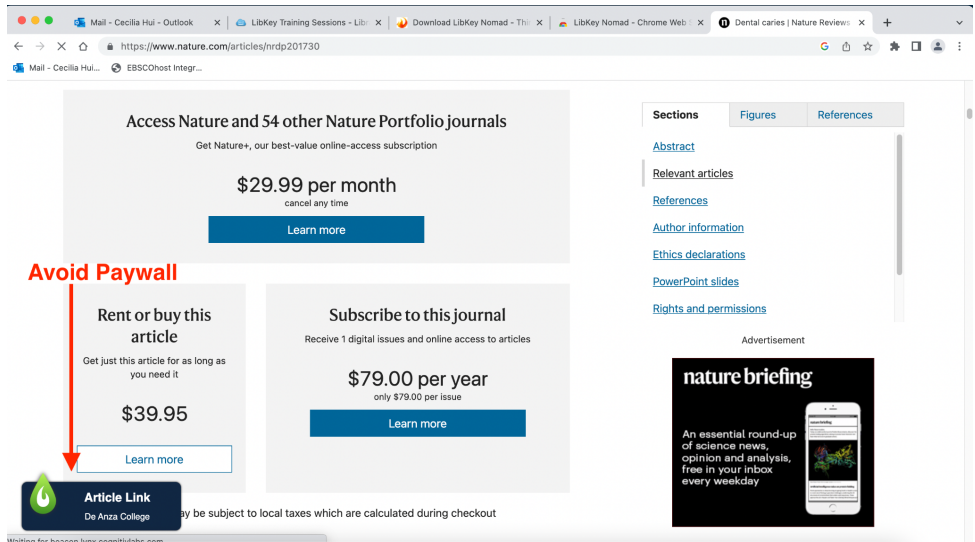
