 - An equity-based structure to Classified Senate

 - Recognition that not all people participating in Senate have equal amounts of time to devote to these duties.

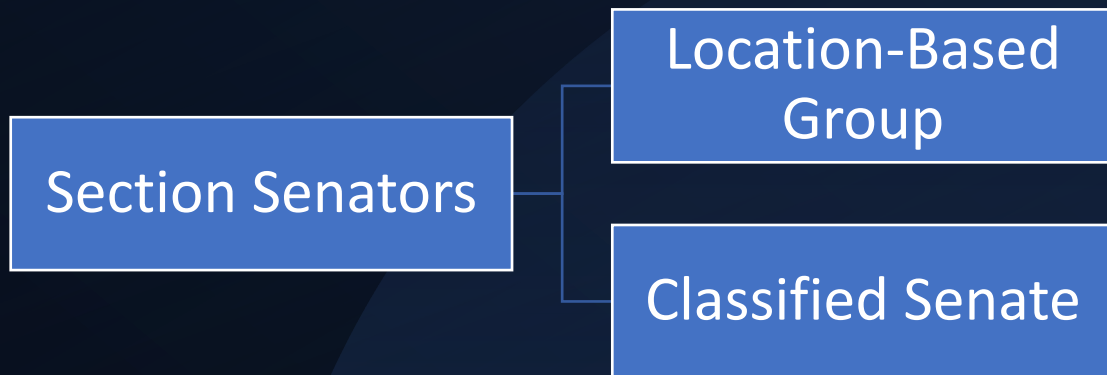
Historical Context

- Classified Senators have previously been elected by sections based on location.
- This location-based procedure was designed with the idea that Senators would disperse information to their physical areas.
- With the way communication has changed, and the way different departments are now spread across campus, location-based senators do not provide the structure they once did.

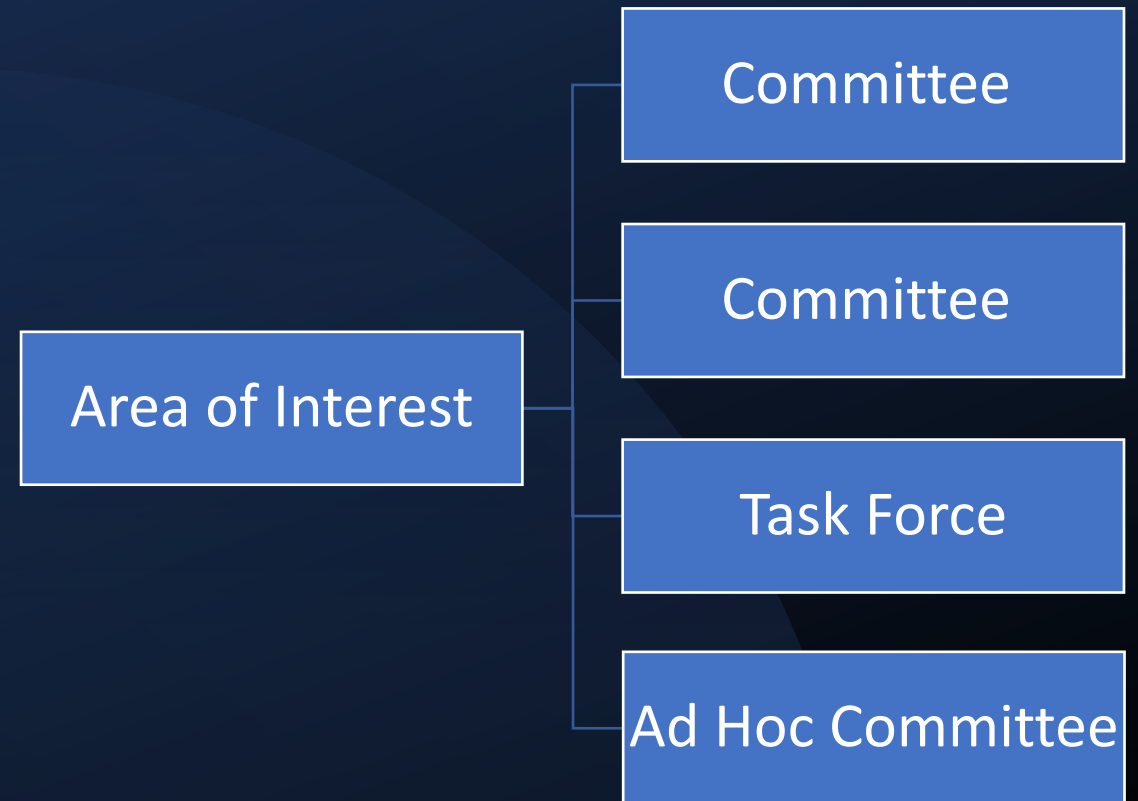


Proposed NEW Structure of Classified Senate

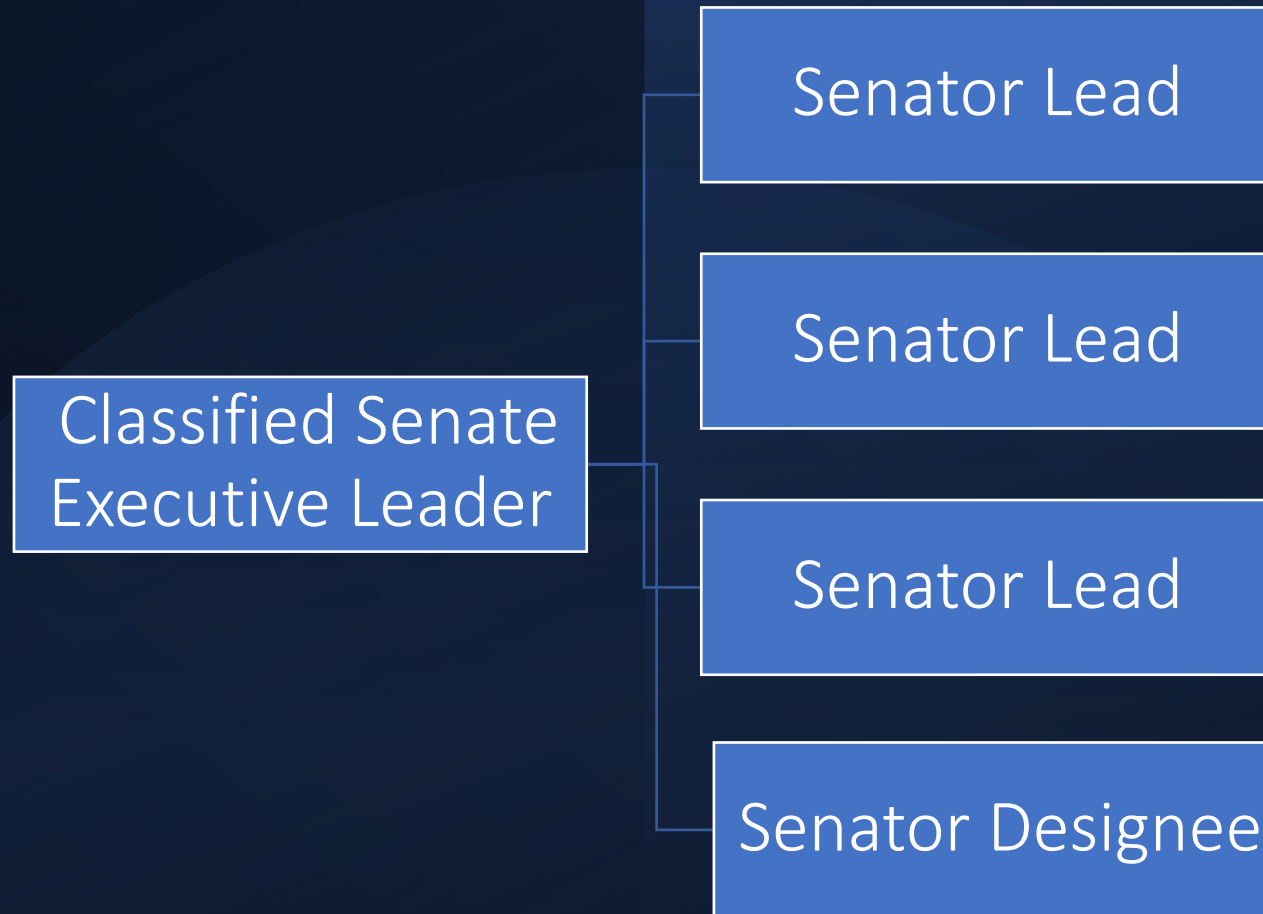

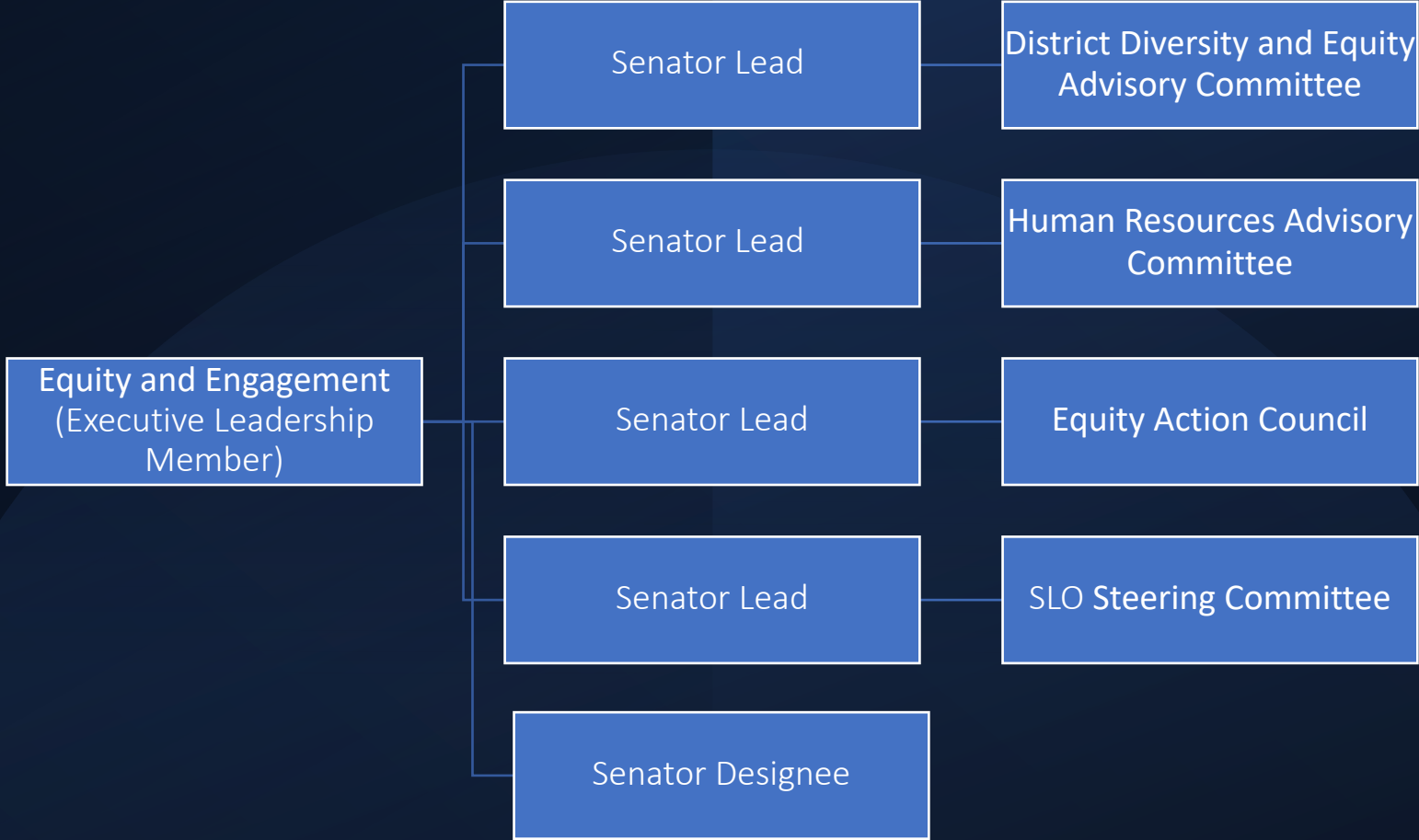
Roles of Classified Senate



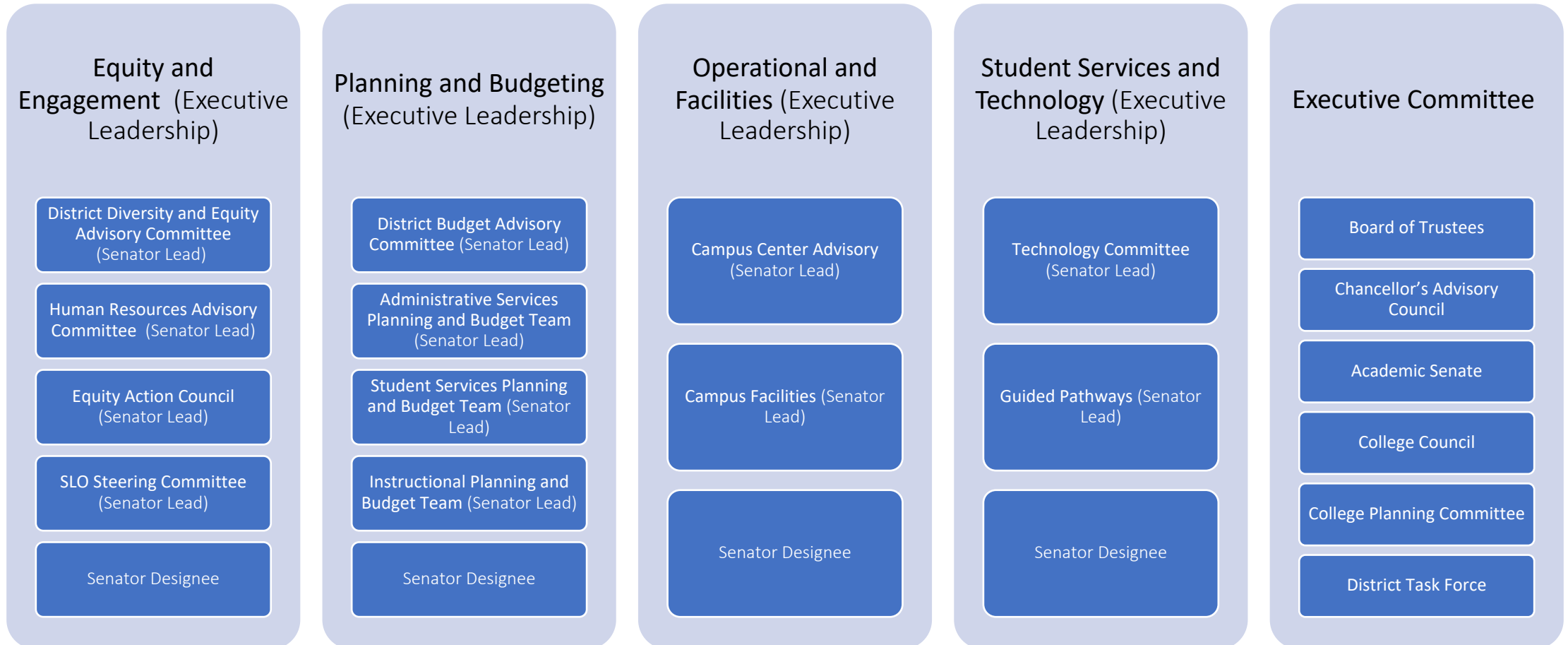
Roles and New Roles

- Executive Leaders
 - UNCHANGED: President, President-Elect, Treasurer, Secretary, Communications Officers
 - CHANGE: Executive Leaders will take on an organizational role in each area of interest.
- Senators
 - CHANGE: Senators will split to Senator Leads and Senator Designee in Areas of Interest.
 - CHANGE: Senator Leads will report to an Executive Leader and work with their Area of Interest to fill seats on some committees.
 - CHANGE: Senator Leads will serve on a secondary Shared Governance committee.
 - CHANGE: Senator Designees will support the Area of Interest and fill in when people are out. They may or may not serve on a secondary Shared Governance committee.
 - UNCHANGED: At-Large members (non-senators) will still be asked to fill seats on Shared Governance committees.
